

# Environmental Emergency Response Notification Plan

## James Hardie Carole Park

James Hardie has prepared a comprehensive Environmental Emergency Response Management Plan (EERMP) for its facility located in Carole Park, QLD.

The information set out below relates to the procedures for notification of an environmental emergency incident causing or threatening serious or material harm to the environment, as defined by the QLD Environmental Protection Act 1994, to owners and occupiers of premises in the vicinity of James Hardie's Carole Park facility and to persons and authorities required by the Environmental Protection Act and Regulations.

### Actions to be taken during or immediately after an emergency incident

In the event of an emergency incident occurring, the following steps are to be taken:

- Ensure the safety of yourself and anyone in the vicinity and contain the pollution incident if safe to do so
- Rescue anyone in immediate danger.
- Raise the alarm immediately.

### **Incidents causing or threatening serious or material harm to the environment**

Notify people on site in the immediate area of the incident.

If an **immediate emergency** and an **uncontrolled event** call:

### **Site Service Providers**

The Plant Manager is responsible for contacting the appropriate external authorities and the site service providers if a given source is affected by a major pollution incident.

## Neighbouring Premises

The Site EHS Coordinator/Manager is responsible for contacting site security and the occupiers of neighbouring premises as soon as possible in the event of a pollution incident that causes material harm and for providing them with regular updates on the situation of the pollution incident.

## Responsibility for providing updates

It is possible that not all of the information that is required to be reported, as captured in the pollution incident report, will be known at the time of the initial communication to both the authorities and the external stakeholders. The Plant Manager and the site EHS Coordinator are responsible for **immediately** informing these parties, as per the communication protocol established above, of any new information as it becomes available.

**\* If the Plant Manager cannot be contacted and/or is unable to make the calls to the relevant external authorities, contact the Site EHS Coordinator/Manager and if they are unavailable, please contact the EHS Manager Asia Pacific. Those persons are then responsible for the notifications the Plant Manager would have made.**
